



Vehicle Sales Volume




Net Sales (Consolidated)

Support Activities Related to COVID-19 (1)

Conducted the following activities to support medical and health care facilities

- 1) Provided face shields made in-house (Kanagawa Pref: 1000; Hiratsuka City: 490)
- 2) Made face shield parts using 3D printers (660/week with Nissan companies)
- 3) Donated dust masks (1,365 masks via Japan Auto Body Industries Association)

Office Measures to Prevent the Spread of COVID-19

Comply with the National and Japan Business Federation's Guidelines on Prevention Infection

- 1) Temperature checks (every morning)
- 2) Mask wearing *In-house product, aim for self sufficiency
- 3) Hand washing (7 times/day or more)
- 4) Sterilization and disinfection
- 5) Ventilation
- 6) Expansion of telework (HQ departments)
- 7) Avoidance of the '3 Cs' (via remote meetings, staggered work times, etc.)
- 8) Installation of droplet infection prevention partitions
